We are a successful wildlife conservation and environmental education charity with a vision for building a vibrant community in the heart of London where people and wildlife can thrive. We do this through:

- Habitat management of our grounds and intertidal zones, which are some of the most biodiverse areas for their size in London
- Educating adults on the value of these habitats, Deptford Creek and the local area
- A formal education programme of adventurous, hands-on learning for schools, colleges, universities
- Delivering activities for family learning
- Working with developers to improve land management in the area
- Working with volunteers who are vital in supporting this work

Role Summary

Volunteers support the Conservation Team at Creekside who are responsible for managing the wildlife habitats at Creekside Discovery Centre and other sites such as Sue Godfrey Nature Park. Every Wednesday Conservation Volunteers work as a group to carry out vital conservation tasks in these spaces. Working as part of a team volunteers assist with litter picking, the removal and management of invasive species, general habitat management, maintenance of site infrastructure, and much more. Optional volunteering opportunities include data recording and assisting with public events such as Wildflower Pop-ups.

This is a great opportunity for anyone interested in getting closer to nature, learning more about the local flora and fauna, and contributing to the biodiversity of the locality in a positive, practical way. This role takes place each Wednesday, and volunteers can attend for a half day or full day session. Conservation volunteering takes place year round.

Duties

- 1. Support CET conservationists with the practical management of wildlife habitats.
- 2. Using tools to complete conservation tasks, where appropriate training and guidance has been given.
- 3. Support CET staff and other volunteers with physically active tasks such as vegetation management or species removal.
