This week's topic is **Shipwrecked**



### At Creekside Discovery Centre this week ...

Creekside continues to erupt with life inside and around the creek, there are lots of plants starting to flower on-site and some of these are edible. Some of the edible plants that are doing really well at the moment and grow here are Yarrow, Daisy, Cowslip and Rocket. Remember that many plants are also poisonous so you have to be very careful when looking for edible plants and you should only do this with a trained adult. Did you know that there used to be a shipyard at the mouth of Deptford Creek? In 1513 King Henry VIII founded the dockyard to build ships for the Royal Navy. It remained one of the most important naval yards for over 300 years, closing in 1869. Hundreds of warships and many trading ships were built here including, The Golden Hind. Several ships used by James Cook were refitted in Deptford including, HMS Endeavour and HMS Discovery.

Things to think about:

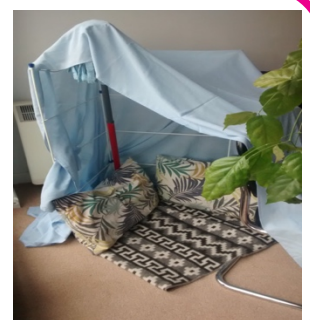
- How will you make sure the water is safe to drink?
- What food will you be able to eat? Are there any edible plants growing in the area?
- How will you make the shelter?
  - Where will you make your shelter? In an exposed or protected area?
  - What resources will you need to collect in order to make your shelter?
  - Remember, you can use any resources in the natural environment or things that might have been washed up from the wreck.
- What are you going to need to make a fire?
  - Where should you make your fire?
  - What kind of materials will be best to burn on the fire?



## Make your own shelter

Collect items from around your home that will be good for making a shelter. Items that I found useful were: sheets, clothes drier, chair, mop or broom, cushions and a blanket. You can also use houseplants to camouflage your shelter.

Make sure that you check with an adult at home that it is okay to use any items and that you use and carry everything safely.



Remember, do not try all of these activities at home. We are just using our imaginations, you should **never** make a fire or try any flowers without a trained adult.



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
